Note regarding Three Overlays and the Faith & Reason Requirement: As noted on the previous page, in addition to the courses outlined in the typical course sequence, students must complete: (1) one course certified in diversity, globalization, or non-Western studies, (2) one ethics-intensive course, and (3) one writing-intensive course. Many major courses, as well as electives, select GEP courses, or minor courses may be used to fulfill these overlays. Below are specific guidelines for each class with regard to overlay requirements and the Faith & Reason signature core course:

Class of 2015: Of the four GEP requirements, Faith Reason and the three overlay requirements, students in the class of 2015 need to satisfy three of the four. Students in the class of 2015 would have to complete (1) a Faith and Reason course and two overlay requirements OR (2) all three overlay requirements.

Class of 2016: Must take Faith Reason and **two of the three** overlay requirements.

Sequencing: We recommend that students take their introductory POL courses (POL 11x) in their first two years (although the order students take the intros doesn't matter). Please note, however, that POL 117 is typically offered only once a year, and that the Sophomore Seminars are only offered in the Spring. Also note: **Internship requirement** applies only to **Class of 2017 and beyond**. Others take any POL UD, including the internship.
