Class of 2014 students need to complete either (1) a Faith & Reason course and one overlay requirement OR (2) two overlay requirements.

**Change in Overlay/Faith & Reason Requirement for the Class of 2015** Of the four GEP requirements—Faith Reason and the three overlay requirements—students in the Class of 2015 need to satisfy three of the four. Class of 2015 students need to complete either (1) a Faith & Reason course and two overlay requirements OR (2) all three overlay requirements.
