<p>Additional Information – Overlays and Faith & Reason Requirements</p> <p>CLASS OF 2014: Of the four GEP requirements (Faith & Reason and the three overlays), students in the Class of 2014 need to satisfy two of the four requirements. This means that students in the Class of 2014 are required to complete (1) a Faith and Reason course and one overlay requirement OR (2) two overlay requirements.</p> <p>CLASS OF 2015: Of the four GEP requirements (Faith & Reason and the three overlays), students in the Class of 2015 need to satisfy three of the four. Students in the Class of 2015 are required to complete (1) a Faith and Reason course and two overlay requirements OR (2) all three overlay requirements.</p> <p>CLASS OF 2016: Students in the Class of 2016 need to satisfy only two of the three GEP overlay requirements. Students in the Class of 2016 must complete the GEP Faith Reason requirement.</p>
