


# Guide to Finding Courses that meet the GEP requirements

This guide provides directions for searching for courses that meet the signature and variable core requirements for the GEP using the General Class Schedule Search.

## Searching for Courses

- Log into the Nest and click on **Classes & Registration**.
- In the **Registration Tools** section (section 3), click on the General Class Schedule Search.

**Extended Comments:** Modern and contemporary artists and architects have engaged the many intersections between art and religions, and unprecedented globalization has helped spur dialogs among a wide range of creeds and has called attention to artists' (sometimes controversial) visual responses to religion worldwide. This course also considers debates raised in recent exhibitions and scholarly texts. Artists studied include VanGogh, Warhol and Kahlo. Although some emphasis is placed on the relationship between art and Catholicism, students also analyze creative responses to many faiths, including other forms of Christianity, Judaism, Hinduism, Buddhism, and Islam.
