

Tips for Pharmacy Writers

Be Formal

Avoid using "I" and "me," except when making recommendations.

Use Passive Voice

Like scientific writing, passive voice is preferred in pharmacy writing.

Be Specific

Make sure your language is unambiguous; for example, write "the drug" instead of "it." Check your writing for any potential sources of confusion.



Use NLM Citations

When a source is used in consecutive sentences, the superscript citation goes at the end of the LAST sentence.

Explain Your Stats

Include whether or not the statistics are significant. Is P-value >0.05? Does 0 or 1 cross the confidence interval with respect to explaining a difference or ratio? What does this tell you?
